# Life at Mentor High School

- School day:
  - 7:22 am - 2:26 pm
  - Late Start Wednesday - 8:05 am
- 8 class periods: 48 minutes each
- 5 minutes between classes
- 22 minute lunch / 22 minute study hall
- All students issued an individual locker

# Success for High School

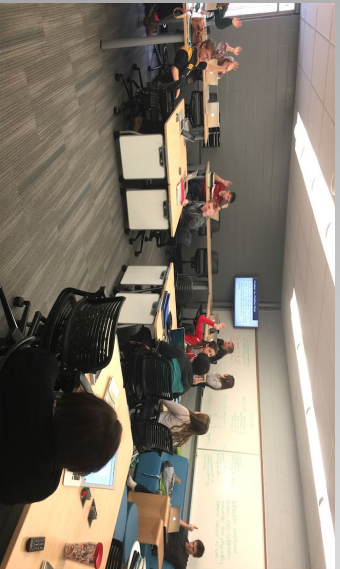
- Organizational skills and good study habits

# Mentor Graduation Requirements

- **4 credits** ENGLISH
- **4 credits** MATHEMATICS
- **3 credits** SCIENCE
- **3 credits** SOCIAL STUDIES
- **1/2 credit** PHYSICAL EDUCATION
- **1/2 credit** ONLINE HEALTH
- **1 credit** Business or Technology or FCS or Art or Music, or World Language
- **5 credits** ELECTIVES
- **21 Credits** TOTAL MINIMUM REQUIREMENT

# College Core

**\*More rigorous than MHS graduation requirements**

- **4 credits**      **ENGLISH**
- **4 credits**      **MATHEMATICS**
- **3 credits**      **SCIENCE**
- **3 credits**      **SOCIAL STUDIES**
- **2 credits**      **WORLD LANGUAGE**
  - Same language
  - Some colleges may require three years
- **1 credit**      **VISUAL/PERFORMING ARTS**

# Criteria for Honors Diploma

Students need to fulfill 7 of the following 8 criteria

<i>Subject</i>	<i>Criteria</i>
English	4 units
Mathematics	4 units, including Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II or equivalent and another higher level course
Science	4 units, including physics and chemistry
Social Studies	4 units
Foreign Language	3 units (must include no less than 2 units for which credit is sought) i.e., 3 units of one language or 2 units each of two languages
Fine Arts	1 unit
Grade Point Average	3.5 on a 4.0 scale
ACT/SAT Score [excluding scores from the writing sections]*	27 ACT / 1210 SAT

# Three Graduation Options

- Acquire 18 points on state-mandated exams.

-OR-

- Acquire a *College Readiness* score on the ACT/SAT.

-OR-

- Acquire an industry certification and a work readiness score on *WorkKeys*.

# State Mandated Exams

## State Tests

- Algebra I
- Geometry
- Biology
- American History
- American Government
- English I
- English II

Must earn 18 points

- 4 points in English
- 4 points in Math
- 6 points in Science and Social Studies



# College/Career Readiness Test

Math 22 or higher

Reading 22 or higher

## **SAT Exam Scores**

Writing 430 or higher

Math 520 or higher

Reading 450 or higher
